4. The Transfiguration of Our Lord

We pray for all young people, that they might have an encounter with Christ. Awed by His beauty and transformed by His love, may they commit themselves to serving Him wholeheartedly.

5. The Institution of the Eucharist

Christ is alive, and He remains always present to His Church in the Most Blessed Sacrament. May God call forth many young men to be priests who will offer the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, so that no tabernacle is ever left empty.



GLORIOUS MYSTERIES (SUNDAY, WEDNESDAY)

1. The Resurrection of Our Lord

Christ is alive, and He bestows new life on all His children. We pray for many more priests and religious to carry on Christ's work of leading the faithful to everlasting life.

2. The Ascension of Our Lord

The Lord reigns over all from His heavenly throne. May all those who are discerning a vocation to the priesthood or religious life keep their eyes on Christ and their hearts fixed on the things that are eternal.

3. The Descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost

The fear of the Apostles was transformed into a holy boldness by the outpouring of the Spirit at Pentecost. We pray for the Church, that she might be renewed through the witness, work, and prayers of holy priests and religious.

4. The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

God willed that the body of the Blessed Virgin Mary might not see corruption. May many young people be willing to consecrate their bodies to the Lord for the sake of the Kingdom of Heaven.

5. The Coronation of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Christ desires to reign over every nation, every age, and every heart. May all people seek to be loyal subjects of Christ the King.

4. The Way of the Cross

Our Lord was led like an innocent lamb to the slaughter. May all those who are discerning their vocations embrace their crosses and walk alongside Christ.

5. The Crucifixion of Our Lord

Jesus Christ offered the perfect sacrifice on Calvary. Following His example, may many young people choose to lay down their lives in heroic service to the Church.
